It's not news that Miguel Cardona is a charter school authorizer, and that's worth celebrating

On March 1, 2021, the U.S. Senate confirmed, Miguel Cardona, President Biden's nominee for U.S. Secretary of Education. He appears to be a prudent choice for Biden, earning support from teachers unions and education reform groups, including charter operators.

Prior to this, Cardona served as Connecticut's Commissioner of Education. He held many education positions before becoming commissioner in August of 2019, including elementary school teacher, principal, district administrator, deputy superintendent, and adjunct professor. He has also led various statelevel groups, co-chairing both the Connecticut Legislative Achievement Gap Task Force and the Connecticut Birth to Grade Three Leaders Council.
